Arrive in Cairns. You will be transferred by coach from Cairns Airport to your hotel and Welcome Dinner.

Capital of the Tropical North Queensland—where the rainforest meets the reef. Cairns is the gateway to the tropical wilderness rainforest and spectacular Great Barrier Reef. Set between the spectacular twin backdrops of the mountain ranges and a sparkling Coral Sea Cairns has the sophistication of many world class resorts, restaurants, entertainment and boutique shopping all within a lush tropical setting. Cairns is world famous for its big game fishing. As well as being a major city for tourism, Cairns is an important centre for agriculture.

Wednesday 31 Jan 2018 Cairns (Great Barrier Reef)

Full breakfast at your hotel. Please ensure you take with you on your cruise today: towel, swimwear, sunscreen, hat, sunglasses and cash or credit card for on board purchases. This morning we depart our hotel by coach for the Martin Jetty, where our journey to 'Marine World' on the Outer Barrier Reef, the most spectacular undersea garden in the world, begins. Inclusions: 5 hours of coral viewing vessel tours, Great Barrier Reef presentation onboard, all snorkeling equipment and instructions, Underwater Observatory, complimentary tea/coffee on boarding, full morning and afternoon tea, hot/cold Tropical smorgasbord lunch. Glass bottom boat is another magical way to experience the reef. Depart the reef at 3:30 pm to arrive back in Cairns at approximately 5:15 pm for transfer back to hotel. Dinner on own at leisure.

Thursday 1 Feb 2018 Cairns (Kuranda)

Full breakfast at your hotel. Depart this morning for the Freshwater Rail Station, for this historic rail journey which will take us past sugar cane fields and up the slopes leading to the Barron Gorge. The journey ends in Kuranda, principal town of the Atherton Tablelands, located some 2000 feet above sea level and a rich farmland area. From here we travel to the Rainforestation Tour World Heritage rainforest by World War II amphibious Army Ducks, a totally unique and exciting experience on land and water. Our Nature Guide or 'Duck Captain' is well versed in the rainforest ecology and will identify and explain the many different species of flora and fauna of the forest. Traverse part of the property and see Tree Ferns, Staghorns and Elkhorns, rare orchids and learn about the amazing Strangler Fig and Stinging trees. Our guide will explain the mysteries of the ancient ferns and trees and their uses by the aborigines. You may see butterflies, including the famous Ulysses and Cairns Birdwing, birds like the Azure Kingfisher and the Rainbow Bee-Eater plus a host of other animals and reptiles. You will also enjoy a tropical bush barbecue lunch before travelling to Kuranda where we have free time to explore this tranquil village. From here we travel down from Kuranda by catching the scenic Skyrail Gondola for the journey back to the coast, literally passing through and over the heights of the rainforest, and then transfer to our hotel for a well earned rest. Dinner on own at leisure.



Flight Cairns / Sydney

Sydney, capital of New South Wales was founded in 1788 and is Australia's oldest city. Sydney sits astride Port Jackson, one of the most beautiful deep water harbours in the world. With a population of just over 4 million, Sydney is also Australia's largest city. The city boasts famous landmarks such as the Harbour Bridge and the Sydney Opera House, as well as a fine array of restaurants, theatres, shopping complexes and some of Australia's best surfing beaches.

You will be met at the airport by your guide for a half day sightseeing tour. Travel through Paddington, with its beautifully restored colonial terrace houses. Drive past Kings Cross, scene of Sydney's nightlife, St Mary's Cathedral and the Art Gallery to. See Chinatown and Darling Harbour before heading to historical Mrs Macquarie's Chair, where you can photograph the Opera House and Harbour Bridge together. See Sydney's commercial and shopping heart, with its mixture of old and new buildings. Enjoy a guided tour of the Sydney Opera House, as your guide shares the stories and secrets behind this international landmark. Enjoy dinner in hotel and one night stay in Sydney. (Touring may vary depending on flight times.)

As we sail into the narrow fjords of the Milford Sound, your massive ship seems to shrink in comparison to the towering cliffs. Situated within Fiordland National Park, this natural wonder is part of the Te Wahipounamu World Heritage Site and is protected by its geography, which makes it a haven for all types of wildlife.



Were it not for the absence of the Scottish brogue, you might think you'd landed in Edinburgh. Both the scenery and the architecture borrow heavily from Scotland. You can even shop for kilts or dig into a piece of fresh haggis. Dunedin is also home to New Zealand's only castle, a 15-year endeavor with the only staircase of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere and magnificent woodwork.

Monday 12 Feb 2018 Akaroa, New Zealand ____ B,L,D

Nestled in the heart of an ancient volcano, Akaroa is rich with beautiful bays, French and English colonial history, even the largest little penguin colony on the mainland. It's also home to the rarest and smallest marine dolphin and lots of water sportskayaking, sailboats, also hiking paths and cycle tours. Pick up a unique souvenir from one of the many local craft shops and boutiques.

New Zealand's capital offers stunning views of forested peninsulas, dramatic cliff-side homes and fine Victorian buildings. Settled in 1840 by the London-based New Zealand Company, "wonderful, windy Wellington" is frequently buffeted by bracing winds funnelling through Cook Strait. The sophisticated metropolis boasts museums, winding streets and even a cable car. No wonder many travelers compare it to San Francisco. Despite its steep hills, the city can be easily explored on foot.

Wednesday 14 Feb 2018 Napier, New Zealand B,L,D

Napier, a coastal city on New Zealand's North Island, is set amid the renowned wine-producing region of Hawke's Bay. Rebuilt after a 1931 earthquake, the city is known for art deco landmarks like the zigzag-patterned Daily Telegraph Building. Along the tree-lined waterfront promenade the Marine Parade, the Pania of the Reef statue depicting a Maori maiden, is a symbol of the city.
